

# Medal Design Competition

## Can you help design a piece of history?

With the NatWest International Island Games returning to Guernsey in July 2021, the Organising Committee would like to offer Bailiwick residents the opportunity to design the medals for the Guernsey Games.

Athletes from 24 different Islands will be coming to the Island to participate in 14 sports. Although the Island Games are known as the friendly games, the medals are still vitally important to those participants who win one and will be a lifelong reminder of their achievement.

As well as the honour of seeing their design used for all of the medals during the Games, the overall winner will also receive their own commemorative set of medals and will be given the opportunity to present the winners' medals at one of the events during the week. All of the shortlisted finalists will receive VIP tickets to the opening ceremony of the Games.

**The judging panel will shortlist three designs. A public vote will then be held to select the overall winning design.**

## What you need to do to enter

## Guidelines

- The Medal must be able to hang on a ribbon around the neck. The 2cm wide ribbon will be supplied separately so you do not need to design this, but you will need to allow for this in your design.
- The medals must represent gold, silver and bronze positions, but we would welcome any creative ways to represent this - the medals do not necessarily have to be made from metal.
- Please do not be restrained by the traditional shape of a circular medal; this is your chance to get creative.
- The height of the medal should not exceed 7cm and the width should not exceed 7cm.
- All entries **must** include the wording "Guernsey 2021 NatWest International Island Games XIX" and the logo of the International Island Games Association on either the front or back of the medal (logo shown opposite and available to download at guernsey2021.gg).
- The shortlisted designs will need to be approved by the International Island Games Association (IIGA) Committee and NatWest International. They will both have final approval on the overall winner.
- There is a budget for the production of the medals. We will consult with technical advisors regarding the production of the shortlisted designs, and will notify the finalists of any necessary changes that may need to be made to their design due to manufacturing constraints. Remember - a simple design often works best.

## Competition Timetable subject to change if necessary

- End May** Closing date for entries
- End June** Judging panel decides on top three designs (after consultation with technical advisors)
- July** Designs presented to IIGA and NatWest International
- August** Public voting opens until the end of September
- October** Final design submitted to IIGA and NatWest International for approval and winner announced
